On June 8th, the Project Alert Team and their coach Mrs Middlemiss, fly to the United States to represent MHJC and New Zealand at the 'Future Problem Solving, International Community Problem Solving Competition'. The show featured both adult and student entries and was judged by a panel of four judges included celebrity fashion designers Patrick Steele and Kevin Buchanan. MHJC competed against students from Year 7 up to Year 13 and were delighted that all of their garments were selected for the final show.

MHJC students worked incredibly hard to design and complete the costumes so quickly, overcoming many challenges along the way. MHJC's

competition involves competing with over 100,000 students from over 1100 schools in over 20 countries. Students have been translating into and out of various including languages Afrikaans, French, German, Japanese, Spanish, Indonesian, Latin, Malay, Samoan, Tongan and many more. Last year our school placed 6th globally and 2nd nationally at the conclusion of the 2013 World Champs.

At the time of this newsletter going to print today, MHJC students had earned over 140 awards, including 9 of the top Elite awards for students with over 10,000 points. Historically, less than 1% of students achieve this, so for 9/208 students to have done so already is wonderful. We are firmly within the top 5 in the world overall, and lead the world in Maori, while coming a close second in Tongan and Samoan.
