Managing Traffic Safety

As the rolls at both MHP and MHJC get bigger we now have more foot traffic leaving our schools at the end of the school day and more vehicle traffic on Jeffs Road.

Some parents have expressed concern that they cannot enter the school in vehicles to collect their children until 3:45 pm. The decision to shut the school off to vehicle traffic until all pedestrian traffic is cleared from both schools is in direct response to



identified safety issues. We have had several near miss accidents where drivers were looking for their child on the pavements rather than concentrating on the other children crossing across the driveways in front of them or where children ran out to meet their parents in front of other vehicles. The mix of vehicles and young students is a potentially deadly mix and so we took the decision to close the gates during this time.

Once they have left the school grounds, students should cross only at the controlled crossings and we ask that parents park on surrounding streets and either wait there for their children or park and walk to the school to collect them.

One accident due to driver inattention or students rushing out to meet their parent's car is one too many and we do ask for your assistance in keeping all students safe.


