Community Problem Solvers Win National Titles!

This year a number of students have worked on Community Problem Solving as part of their DEEP programme.

Two of these teams learned at the start of Term 4 that they had gained selection to attend the national finals. A combined MHP and MHJC team, C.C.C. (Creative Cyber Citizens) including Anusha and Liam from MHJC, competed in the Junior Section. The team coached by Mrs Vohra and Miss Wills from MHP focussed on developing positive cyber citizenship in young primary students and have already been in class delivering lessons. The team has formed a relationship with Hector's World, an award winning cyber safety organisation, and aims for MHP to become NZ's first Hector's School.

T.A.N.E. (Trees Are Nature's Educators), coached by Mrs Middlemiss, competed in the Middle Division. Daisy, Helen, Alex, Georgia, Christopher and Cara, have worked hard to gain approval from Manukau City Council to open up and officially adopt the neighbouring bush reserve as a learning environment for both schools. They will continue to work alongside the Council, our Enviro students and community groups to create a low impact track, repair bridges and clear weeds and rubbish from the long abandoned bush reserve. They intend to create an audio tour to educate students about the beauty and wonder of our precious native trees and birds.

The teams now need to raise \$75,000 to travel to Wisconsin for the International finals in June 2010. If you have any fundraising suggestions we would love to hear from you.
