
### TravelWise Award Winner

# LANGUAGE PERFECT WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

19 - 29 MAY 2014

## Language Perfect World Championships

MHJC competed for the third time this year in the annual Language Perfect World Championships. 208 of our students took on over 300,000 students from more than 1150 schools around the world in this competition, which involves online translation challenges of vocabulary in 20 languages and English.

We are proud to share that MHJC came **first in New Zealand** in this competition, and **third in the world**. This is a fantastic achievement, which comes down to dedicated students and the support of staff and families. Of our 208 entrants, an amazing 157 students achieved an award. We won 30 (5% of the total) of the top awards, of which only 606 were allocated worldwide. We were first in the world for Maori, and second for Samoan. We were first in New Zealand for Maori, Italian and Indonesian.

# Language skills impress

TWO East Auckland schools have proven to be right up there with the rest of the world at the Language Perfect World Championships.

The championships are held online for students of any age up to university level and is run over a 10-day period in May.

Mission Heights Junior College placed first in New Zealand and third in the world with its team of 208 students.

More than 300,000 students from 1150 schools in more than 20 countries competed in the championships, which is run online with an accumulative point system.

Each student can select what languages they would like to focus on with 20 to choose from – they then have to get a word right three times before a point is scored.

The children's scores from each school are tallied up to give the school an overall total.

Mission Height's Japanese teacher Trudi Wigg says the school has a small number of competitors compared to some others.

"The school that won had 2000 people competing," she says.

Mission Heights Junior College also came first in Maori and second in Samoan in the world.

Yvonne Ruan, 14, an elite competitor scoring more

than 10,000 points, says the school was definitely better than last year and will now set goals to improve for 2015.

"We felt good though because we were the smallest school in the world top 10."

Pakuranga College was also up on the world leaderboard after coming first in the world for Japanese with its 120 competitors.

Japanese teacher Lisa Cumberland says it was the college's fifth consecutive year of being first in the world for the language.


"The goal was to be top of Japanese again so we just focused mainly on that one language."

Students are also individually ranked, with Pakuranga College gaining the individual world winner Jason Wu who got exactly 50,000 points.

The competition is held annually and students use the Language Perfect Programme for online study and exam preparation.
