

# Patrols keep kids safe

The police and the Eastern Courier are teaming up for the Marching On Campaign. Rose Cawley will report on the kids who make walking to and from school safe, champions of walking school buses, great walk ways and safety.

The 13-year-old has been slogging it out as a road patrol monitor for four years and says it is crazy what some adults will do behind tweel.

"We have people who stop right before the crossing and let their children out even though the signs are up and they should be moving. Traffic piles up behind them," he says.

He's also witnessed a near miss and encourages drivers to keep the safety of children in mind.
