# The Great Kiwi Walk Competition

Year 7 and 8 students in Mountains Whanau have been busy walking this term, as part of the **Department of Conservation's** "Great Virtual Walker" competition. Classwork has focused on conservation issues, ecosystems and habitats, mapping and compass work, all relating to being in the great outdoors. Classes have also been busy trying to walk at least half the distance of one of New Zealand's Great Walks, with some having walked over 40 kilometres this term.

Year 8 students visited the Auckland Botanical Gardens in early March. They completed an orienteering course, camp cooking and went on a bush trail hike focusing on the identification of native trees and birds. Year 7 students have walked to Barry Curtis Park, Point View Reserve and completed the Hunua Ranges hike whilst at camps. Students commented on how different (and challenging) bush walks are compared to our local, urban walks. They especially enjoyed locating a large geocache hidden in the forest and seeing the Hunua Falls.

Recently classes went on a hike of the Mangemangeroa Valley in Sommerville. Conservation issues (Kauri dieback, pest control) and the habitats (mangroves, pasture, bush and coast) were the key focus of this walk.
