
Message from the Principal

Who would have thought **Mission Heights Junior College** could win **The Volvo Ocean Race** without leaving dry land! **Education Perfect**, the world online educator, worked with race competitors **Team Sun Hung Kai - Scallywag**, to create their own competition event with lessons relating to the science and maths behind sailing, and the core **Sustainability Programme** of **Volvo Ocean Racing**.

Year 9 MHJC students, under the guidance of teacher Mrs Reshmika Lal, took to the contest like ducks to water, blitzing their competitors by earning a total of 558,259 points. Mission Heights Junior College took out both the Top Class (9W2) and overall Top School awards. This brilliant team performance doubled that of the second place finisher with 18 of the top 30 places also going to MHJC students.

For their efforts the team has won a \$200 shared lunch and students say it was the excitement of the racing and the involvement with an actual Volvo Ocean Race crew Scallywag - an international team made up of Australians, British, Dutch and Portuguese male and female sailors that kept the pace going among the students.

The Leadership Challenge required Year 10s to lead groups of Year 8 students through an Amazing Race in and around Albert Park. A second focus on Communication and Teamwork included a visit to the Art Gallery and to find an owl from The Big Hoot art series. The final challenge was completing the Great Escape, with groups locked in a themed room requiring solving puzzles in order to escape. The day trip was a great success with students identifying a range of different challenges and the Year 10's having the opportunity to use many different leadership styles learned in class.



History Class Visit Auckland Museum

Our Year 10 students had an enlightening day out exploring the WWI and WWII galleries at the Auckland Museum. Students spent time with the Museum Librarians learning about their primary source/evidence collections and how to use them. They were also given access to manuscripts that were more than one hundred years old. Some students are planning weekend trips back to use the Museums' Library Collection.

MHJC has the Cutting Edge!

MHJC has taken delivery of a new Laser Cutting machine. Such sophisticated equipment is normally found in large secondary schools and universities and our Year 7 - 10 students will gain a head start in being trained to use this modern technology. Weighing 280 kilos the removal of the machine from the truck to its new home on the top floor of Water Whanau was quite a task with the balcony rail needing dismantling before it was hoisted onto the landing using a truck crane and then rolled in place.

Following commissioning and testing it is now in full use by technology and Inkscape DEEP students, already producing designs for their technology projects that were not possible using the existing laser cutter. The new machine has ten times the laser power and has a cutting speed fifteen times faster with a positional accuracy of 0.05mm. It also cuts and engraves a wide range of materials, except steel.



Leadership Council supporting Auckland City Mission

This term the Leadership Council had identified Auckland City Mission as an important organisation in our community to support. Led by Mrs Ulika Singh, students research showed that over two thousand families are dependant on food parcels from the Mission, each week. This alarming statistic inspired students to contribute to make a difference. A can drive collected 600 cans donated by students and staff.



EDUCATION First over the line in school ocean racing challenge

Who would have thought Mission Heights Junior College (MHJC) could win The Volvo Ocean Race without leaving dry land!

Education Perfect, the world online educator, worked with race competitors Team Sun Hung Kai - Scallywag, to create their own competition event using lessons relating to the science and maths behind sailing as well as the core Sustainability Programme of Volvo Ocean Racing,

The Education Perfect Volvo Ocean Race Challenge took place over 10 days in March, and included participants from more than 250 schools around New Zealand.

MHJC Year 9 students, under the guidance of teacher Mrs Reshmika Lal, took to the contest like ducks to water, blitzing their competitors by adding to the school total of 558,259 points.


