Term 2 Sports Round-up

Sport has grown this year with Term 2 being the busiest sporting Term MHJC has ever experienced. We have twenty-two teams (*approximately 225 students*) playing on a weekly basis, and a further eight teams competing in one-day tournaments and competitions.

MHJC Basketball: We have 6 Junior Teams (ABSL) for Y7 & 8 students, and they are developing their skills in the game. Participation in the ABSL is an excellent opportunity to compete while playing in teams with their friends. Our 5 Senior Basketball Teams (Y9 & 10) are competing in the Counties Manukau Competition on Thursday afternoons. Four boys teams and a girls team, compete in the Y9 & Y10 Grade. Top level coaches have taken the teams from strength to strength, with the opportunity to send teams to the Auckland Basketball Championships next term. The MHJC top senior boys team are currently second in the competition.

MHJC Netball: The Year 8 AIMS Netball team play in the Auckland competition at the Auckland netball centre and have won all their games so far. They have been playing some exceptional netball and continue to improve as AIMS GAMES approaches. The Premier Netball Team have won all their games competing against some of the top schools on Saturday morning and have been promoted. Four other netball teams compete in the Howick-Pakuranga Netball Competition on Wednesday afternoons. Rain, hail or shine the students play to the best of their ability, improving every week.

MHJC Football: We now have five teams (2 senior, 3 Junior) and the senior boys play in the Auckland U14 A2 Grade. The boys finished in the top two in their pool and so go on to play in the Championship round next term. The Girls First XI compete in the Greater Auckland Counties Manukau Junior Grade. Currently placed 4th, the girls, many newcomers to the sport, are improving week by week and celebrated an excellent win against Macleans College. The SEZ Football Tournaments are a highlight for junior footballers, and this term the MHJC Y7 boy's team and our Y8 boy's team placed 4th in their grades.
