Te Ahurea Tino Rangatiratanga

Inā te mahi he rangatira

"By deeds a chief is known".

Enabling every student to reach his or her potential by educating them via their own language and cultural values.

These words are a philosophy from Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwae, a Māori school in Māngere East. They hosted The 2023 Te Ahurea Tino Rangatiratanga (one of two Auckland Secondary School kapa haka regional competitions) and the kaupapa has been going for nearly 25

MHJC and OSC kapa haka were able to join and create a collaborative kapa haka called "Ngā Pou Kahikatea". Matua Willie (OSC) and Matua Leeroy (MHJC) created this name in reference to how the Kahikatea tree grew abundant in Ōtara (now split into the suburbs Mission Heights, Murphy's Park, Ormiston, etc.), and the schools themselves being the "Pou" - the main pillars of the area today, meaning the great pillars of the Kahikatea forest.

This was the first time the local junior and senior schools of Flat Bush have been a part of any Auckland Secondary Regional kapa haka event, so it was a milestone for the two schools involved. Students only had three weeks of intense practices, whereas other schools practiced for months in advance. MHJC is exceptionally proud of all the students, whānau, and teachers involved.
